

# PRAPARE Train the Trainer Academy

**A Learning Community for state Primary Care Associations to support their members in collecting standardized data on the social determinants of health using PRAPARE**

## What Is the PRAPARE Train the Trainer Academy?

To support the rising demand in PRAPARE, the national PRAPARE partners (NACHC, AAPCHO, and OPCA) are launching the second round of a free Train the Trainer Academy for state PCAs and HCCNs to build the knowledge and capacities they need to assist their health centers in PRAPARE implementation, spread PRAPARE throughout their states, and use PRAPARE to affect change at the patient, organization and community levels. and using PRAPARE data for state policy and transformation initiatives. The interactive collaborative training academy will consist of 1-2 in-person trainings, monthly virtual meetings and shared learning and networking opportunities over a 10-month period. The Academy provides support for PCAs to receive tailored PRAPARE training that relates to state contexts, to apply lessons learned with health center members, and to network and learn from other PCAs in a small Learning Community of 8 PCAs. Round Two will occur between August 2018 - May 2019.

- **August 2018: In-person kickoff training in Orlando, Florida as part of NACHC's CHI conference**
- **September 2018 - May 2019: Academy meets regularly**
