What is the Elevate learning forum?

NACHC's Elevate learning forum is designed to help health centers transform their practices to deliver better care at lower cost. The Elevate model aims to enhance existing QI and transformation efforts by helping health centers:

- Self-assess progress in 15 "change areas" identified in NACHC's Value Transformation Framework.
- Access targeted transformation tools and resources.
- Engage in a robust learning forum designed with existing transformation efforts in mind.

What is the Value Transformation Framework?

The Value Transformation Framework, a conceptual model developed by NACHC's Quality Center, identifies and organizes evidence-based interventions to transform health center systems in ways that can lead to improved health outcomes, improved patient and staff experience, and reduced costs (the Quadruple Aim).

What is the purpose of Elevate?

- Creates a national learning forum that uniquely leverages existing transformation efforts for enhanced impact.
- Guides health centers to assess their progress in areas fundamental to advancing on the Quadruple Aim.
- Offers targeted guidance, tools, and resources to help health centers transform and reach their goals.
- Synthesizes the evidence-base and promising practices into actionable steps health centers can implement.
- Connects health centers for learning and exchange.

What is required for health centers to participate?

- Complete online Elevate tool (3 senior staff).
- Identify points-of-contact (3-5 staff leads) for communications and learning opportunities.
- Engage in monthly/bimonthly learning forum webinars/trainings.
- Commit to accelerating progress of existing QI and transformation efforts.

What is required for PCAs/HCCNs to participate?

- Coordinate a group of health centers to engage in Elevate.
- Leverage existing QI/transformation initiatives by accessing learning forum tools, resources, and training.
- Receive health center assessment data (with permission) to advance state/network transformation efforts.

How much does it cost?

Nothing! The Elevate learning forum is free for Health Center Program grantees and coordinating PCAs/HCCNs.

When does Elevate launch?

Elevate will run from January–December 2019. A cohort of 100 health centers will complete a 15-question assessment in December 2018, then access learning forum opportunities beginning in January 2019.

What resources are available to participants?

- Free one-year enrollment in a NACHC learning forum that includes: technical support and resources, monthly/bimonthly calls, and peer-to-peer networking opportunities.
- Free subscription for one staff member to the Institute for Healthcare Improvement's Open School, a curriculum of over 30 online courses in quality improvement.
- Free one-year access to an online document management system that supports compliance with HRSA Health Center Program requirements.

How does my organization sign up?

The initial rollout of Elevate will be limited to 100 health centers as part of a project that will take place January–December 2019. NACHC will coordinate enrollment of health centers through PCAs/HCCNs.

- **If you're a PCA/HCCN:** Submit a [Statement of Interest](#) by November 20, 2018 indicating interest in bringing together a cohort of health centers to engage in the Elevate learning forum.
- **If you're a health center:** Share the opportunity with your PCA/HCCN, and encourage them to submit a [Statement of Interest](#) by November 20th.
