Census Bureau. 2018 Current Population Survey Annual Social and Economic Supplement. Note: Used for state and national estimates of health insurance coverage. Dual eligible beneficiaries enrolled in both Medicare and Medicaid are only included in the Medicare estimates to align with longstanding reporting requirements for health centers to the Uniform Data System.

Endnotes:

Chronic Conditions includes visits for hypertension, diabetes, heart disease, and asthma.

Behavioral Health includes visits for depression and other mood disorders, anxiety disorders (including PTSD), other substance related disorders, tobacco use disorders, alcohol related disorders, and other mental disorders (including mental retardation).

Preventive Services includes visits for health supervision, immunizations, flu shots, oral exams, pap tests, mammograms, Hepatitis B tests, Hepatitis C tests, and HIV tests.
