## Sources (in order of appearance in the State Fact Sheet):

NACHC. August 2019. Estimate based on trends in the Uniform Data System for 2000 – 2018 using data from both federally-funded and look-alike health centers, estimates for annual growth, and national data sources. Note: Used for national estimate of total health center patients for 2018.

Census Bureau. 2018 American Community Survey 1-Year Estimates, Tables B17002, B03002, S2701, S2704, and K202702. Note: Used for state and national estimates of income as a ratio to the poverty level, racial/ethnic minority, insurance state, public coverage, and private coverage, respectively. Medicare coverage may be alone or in combination with another source of coverage; Medicaid is defined as Medicaid/CHIP coverage alone to better align with the Uniform Data System classification of Medicare and Medicaid.

## Endnotes:

Chronic Conditions includes visits for hypertension, diabetes, heart disease, asthma, chronic lower respiratory diseases, and overweight/obesity.

Behavioral Health includes visits for depression and other mood disorders, anxiety disorders (including PTSD), other substance related disorders, tobacco use disorders, alcohol related disorders, and other mental disorders (including mental retardation).

Preventive Services includes visits for health supervision, immunizations, flu shots, oral exams, pap tests, mammograms, Hepatitis B tests, Hepatitis C tests, and HIV tests.
