

Voting by Certified Proxy

An eligible Organizational Member unable to attend the House of Delegates can vote by proxy.

- Under NACHC Bylaws, Organizational Members “in good standing” not sending the Board Chair or Executive Director/CEO to the Annual Meeting, but wishing to vote, may authorize an individual to hold its proxy. Authorization is granted by addressing a letter on the health center’s stationery and signed by the Board Chair or Executive Director/CEO, to the Credentials Committee stating the name of the person who will be holding the proxy. The proxy holder must be employed by or serve on the board of a NACHC Organizational Member or employed by a NACHC-chartered state or regional primary care association.
- An Organizational Member “in good standing” may authorize only one proxy (which carries four [4] votes) on its behalf.
- There is no limit to the number of proxies an individual can be authorized to hold.
- Proxies are not transferable. The designated person cannot assign the proxy to another person.
